Dear Christopher,

Thank you for your donation of \$500 to Lab Rescue LRCP. With your generosity, the Rescue is able to continue our lifesaving work and respond to Labs in jeopardy in shelters and assist dogs whose owners are no longer able to care for them.


The need is great. Almost all of the dogs we rescue would be euthanized without our assistance. Increasingly, the dogs require significant veterinary care to return them to good health. As we rescue more dogs from the South, we are seeing the cases of Heartworm we treat grow, and when we pull from puppy mills, we see the impact of years of neglect. As always, there are the heartbreaking stories of young healthy dogs gravely injured when they are hit by cars. The list of health concerns goes on and on.

Thanks to you we can say "Yes, we will take him" knowing we have the resources for dental work, orthopedic surgery, and more. Of course, some of the dogs we rescue are in good health and just require a spay or neuter and vaccines.

The Rescue is blessed with dedicated volunteers who provide foster care and transportation which helps us focus our funds on veterinary care and means each dollar you donate will have an even greater impact. At any given moment, Lab Rescue is caring for 40, 50, and sometimes up to 100 labs; providing veterinary care, caring foster homes, and matching each dog with a loving adopter.
